What is a Humanities Major?


Humanities expand our knowledge of human cultures and help us understand what binds us together and what differentiates us from one another in a global context.

Humanities is the study of *human culture and* systems of power:

- Race, gender, class, nationality, language, sexual orientation, ability, etc.
- Popular culture and media
- Social justice and revolution
- Storytelling cultures
- Global cultural, political, and social histories
- Social relationships



Studying in the Humanities




